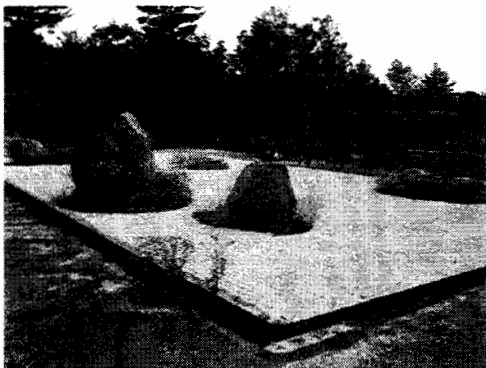
The 20th Anniversary is a landmark in time. In the months ahead leading up to the celebration, it is our intention to keep all friends posted on developments for both the building of the Temple and the plans for the anniversary celebration through updates from *Peace Pagoda News*.

In the early months of spring, construction on the new Temple will be focused on enclosing the 1st floor of the temple – the kitchen, bathrooms, and sleeping areas will be immediately used as construction moves along through the summer. Please see the note from our engineer, Bob Jennings, for further information.

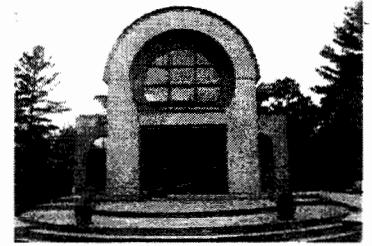
Temple construction will be ongoing right up until Anniversary time, and will continue after the Anniversary. While the goal is to make it livable, there will be much more interior and exterior work that will have to be completed before the Temple will be ready for full inauguration. Those with gifts and skills in construction related fields – electricians, plumbers, finish carpenters, sheet-rockers, etc. are gratefully invited to help.

In the late spring, as soon as the rains stop, the Pagoda will be painted. Stay tuned for notice of the painting parties – we're looking at sometime after Buddha's birthday celebration.

There will be opportunities for all kinds of participation in the actual planning and preparing for the Anniversary Celebration on October 2. Starting in early summer, activities will begin such as flower making, flower tree painting, special gardening, etc. There will be work parties during the week and on the weekends. There are many sorts of projects that require varieties of skills, talents, and energies. There will be something for everyone – from folding flowers to moving brush to weeding the flower beds to mowing the lawn.



Progress: on the New Temple and the Peace Pagoda!



This past year or so has seen much progress in the physical aspects of the Peace Pagoda, the New Temple, and the surrounding grounds.

- 1). Beautiful custom made windows have been installed in the New Temple.
- 2). The stunning Gendai-hoto sama (Stone Stupa) was dedicated in October. Guruji's calligraphy of *Na Mu Myo Ho Ren Ge Kyo* was devoutly hand-carved into the stone by Tom Matsuda, assisted by his son Wataru, and preciousy gold-leafed by his wife, Ikuko Matsuda.
- 3). The meditative Rock Garden and sheltered sitting area are near completion. We are grateful for those who have labored so hard to bring forth these gifts, which encourage contemplative spirit and tranquil mind.
- 4). With gratitude to a local landscaping company who donated their professional help and equipment, a significant leak in the pond has been repaired and the level of water is at the ideal level. Previously, very important work was done to provide proper drainage for the Pagoda, which will make a big difference when it comes time to paint.
- 5). To further facilitate celebrations, the grounds in front of the Pagoda have been enlarged and aesthetically contoured.

Of course, much remains to be done. For the next few months of cold weather, with the Temple relatively "tight" we would like to proceed with preparation and framing of interior walls in coordination with the setting of electrical and water lines and fixtures.

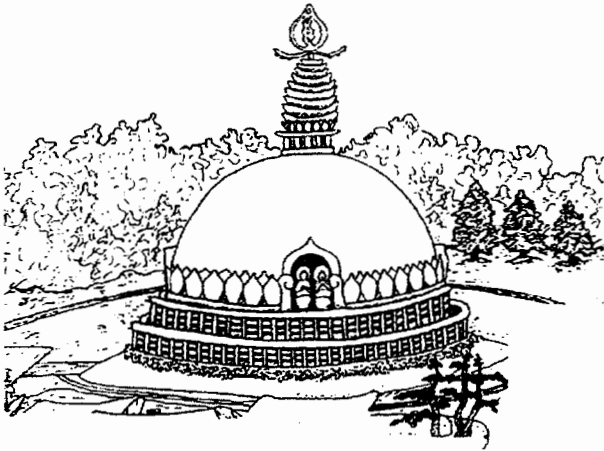

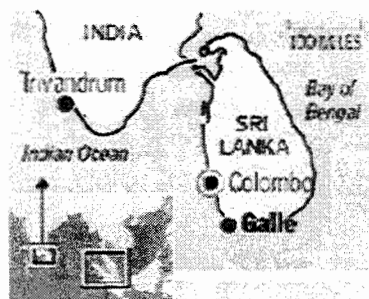

HELP FROM NEW ENGLAND



to GALLE, SRI LANKA

Dear Friends,

On Sunday morning, December 26th, a tsunami reached the shores of Galle, Sri Lanka and struck without warning. Reverend Asami of Nipponzan Myohoji Buddhist Order, working on top of the Galle Peace Pagoda, had a bird's-eye view of the bay. *"Suddenly all the water disappeared, leaving the fish flapping on the bay floor. Children, fascinated, ran out to gather the fish. Fifteen minutes later a wall of water washed them and most of the historic port town of Galle away. The devastation was like nothing ever experienced before. Everything lies in ruin."*

In response to this overwhelming destruction experienced by millions of people in several countries, the New England Peace Pagoda at Leverett Massachusetts, the Grafton New York Peace Pagoda, Noonday Farm, Agape Community, House of Peace and friends want to reach out to help the people of Galle.

We spoke on the phone with Rev. Asami proposing to help rebuild a school, thinking this might be a good way to help our own children become involved. He contacted the elementary school near the Pagoda with our proposal. They are very heartened and encouraged by our concern. But they asked if first, we would also help their damaged health clinic, as health needs are so critical. The tsunami has knocked out the whole first floor, which held all the medical supplies.

Our initial goal to raise 1,000 units of \$20 each (\$20,000) and to collect it as soon as possible so that we can deliver the funds to Rev. Asami who will be able to deliver all donations directly for rebuilding the health clinic and school.

We share this appeal with you to ask if you would donate one or more units of \$20 each. No contribution is too big or too small. Groups of people – students in classrooms, study groups, youth groups, office workers, house mates, exercise groups, churches, etc. - can pool their resources together to make one or more units.

They will bring additional moneys plus book bags from New England School children. We invite all who can, to join us in spirit with your donations of one or more units of \$20 each.

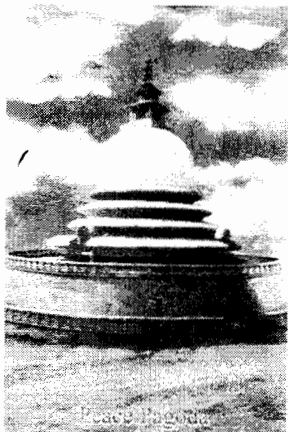

On an island torn by civil war and at a site destroyed by the most recent tsunami, the Galle Peace Pagoda arises as an embodiment of humanity's deepest aspiration for Peace. The Pagoda is situated atop the Rumassala Peak (Bouna Vista) Unwatuna, Galle, a site first colonized by the Portuguese in 1505, marking the beginning of centuries of colonization of the island.

Journeying from the New England Peace Pagoda will be: Kato Shonin, Temmu Shonin, Towbee Shonin, and Irene Michaud. Bob Jennings, Beth Ingham and their son, JR, will also journey to Galle to participate in the inaugural ceremonies, bringing funds for the reconstruction of the health clinic and school and delivering bookbags made by New England school children to the children of Galle. Asami Shonin, who is responsible for building the Galle Peace Pagoda, was a great help during the construction of the Leverett Peace Pagoda 20 years ago. He also initiated the inspiring Sri Lanka – South India Interfaith Pilgrimage for Peace and Life 1993 as a vehicle to bring people together for reconciliation and peace after witnessing the tragic massacres of the civil war conflict.

FRIENDS OF THE PEACE PAGODA
WILL JOIN MONKS
AT GALLE PEACE PAGODA INAUGURATION
TO DELIVER BOOK BAGS
TO GALLE SCHOOL CHILDREN

In response to the unbelievable Tsunami, friends of the Peace Pagoda began a fund-raiser and Book Bag Project to help an elementary school and a health clinic in the Sri Lankan port town of Galle. Those traveling to Galle for the Inauguration will carry the book bags and hand deliver them to the children.

Both projects have been well received. At press-time, over \$7,000.00 has been raised. See enclosed appeal to learn how you may participate.

Book bags are being made by children in 25+ schools, a Brownie Troop, homeschoolers, at a birthday party, a YMCA exercise class., a co-housing group and by individual families. Starting the weekend of January 30th, book bags have begun to be delivered to the various community "book bag stations". We estimate that minimally 1,000 book bags will be delivered to Galle, Sri Lanka.

Publicity in local communities across New England has been gratifying. Parents and educators are sharing with us their gratitude for this "concrete" project. Children have been deeply disturbed by this disaster and the book bags seem to be a great way for them to reach out to their peers with compassion.

The wonders of digital cameras will make it possible for school children to watch as clean-up and rebuilding of the health clinic and school progresses. And it is certain that photos will be taken as the book bags are delivered. Photos and updates may be found at: www.peacepagoda.org.

**GURUJI'S CALL
TO THE NON-VIOLENT
STRENGTH OF THE PEOPLE**
(Peace Pagoda Rajgir India, 1982)

"Although Gandhiji's leadership with the principle of non-violence was more than remarkable, it was truly wondrous and phenomenal that four hundred million followed Gandhiji's guidance- without even a single person resorting to violence. The multitude endured for long, hard suffering years with firm faith in gaining independence through non-violence. Although Gandhiji, who led the non-violent movement, was truly an invaluable and magnificent person, it can be said that the accumulated strength of the four hundred million of India, who brought ahimsa (non-violence) into practice, winning independence, was even greater.

"Today the entire world has become a nuclear arsenal. All the peoples in the world are forced to live fearfully, as if awaiting the time for the fires to be set. It is the strength of the people of the world that will prevent it from happening, not the governments in power.

When the four billion peoples of the world rise up, raising their hands and their voices for peace under renewed international ethics, insisting that they want no more war, they want not to be killed, and never want to kill another; but that they shall live together harmoniously with non-violence...when we can come together in this way we will, by following the example set by India, be able to prevent the disaster by nuclear weapons."

WALK FOR THE NEW SPRING 2005

For the last four years we have walked through the late winter into the beginning of Spring, moving prayerfully over the earth as the earth and the heavens move together to renew the flowering of life in this region.

2005 in the Chinese calendar is the Year of the Rooster. In the spirit of that bird with his insistent wake up call, let us, together, awaken our deepest belief in peace, justice, and life. Let us call upon ourselves and one another to rekindle the spiritual power of what Dr. King called *soulforce* - the most powerful force in this world.

The Walk for a New Spring will give us the opportunity to walk, talk, pray together. Together let us discern how we can set in motion our *soulforce* that will lead to stopping the killing, the return home of our soldiers, and the saving Iraqi and American lives.

All of us are needed to change the current direction of endless war, of massive systemically enforced poverty, of humanity's degradation, and the destruction of this beautiful, natural world.

All of us are needed to remove the veil of confusion from the phrase "war on terror," which immobilizes our thinking. The real anti-dote to threats on the United States is not more weapons, more fear, and more conquests. The real anti-dote is the honest seeking of the source of others' hatred and grudge, and, with our full humanity, addressing those grievances and sincerely acknowledging and atoning the wrong we have done.

We respectfully ask your generous help in organizing a community gathering in your area, and warmly invite your participation in walking a mile a day, or whatever you can. Every one of us matters - all ages, all circumstances. Singly and together we will make possible the transformation that is needed. Let us keep walking, talking, and praying together, forging the path of justice and peace for which all people yearn.

NUCLEAR WEAPONS AND *MAYORS FOR PEACE*

This year, the 60th anniversary of the unleashing of nuclear holocaust on human populations, is a crucial year to reawaken to the reality of today's nuclear weapons. The U.S. has far more nuclear weapons than any other nation and is aggressively designing new nuclear weapons for space, for the earth, and under the earth. But, while the unthinkable is being pursued with great speed and virtually no public awareness or voice, a very important movement has been initiated by the Mayor of Hiroshima. *Mayors for Peace* has begun to galvanize mayors and municipal leaders from around the world to combine their voices and energies in the name of protecting their citizens from the nuclear nightmare.

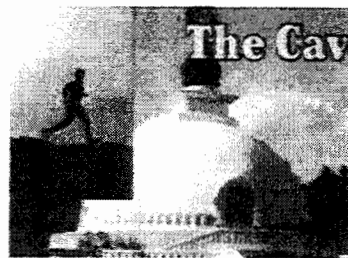

A FIVE MILE RUN AND TWO MILE WALK on the roadways around the Peace Pagoda is being planned for Saturday, April 16.
